Green Note It's getting to be car washing season again - but before you wash, keep these tips in mind. Wash your car on a permeable surface (like grass or gravel) so the water can soak in. Use a biodegradable soap, free of chlorine and phosphates. If you can, use "gray" water for washing (such as water from your washing machine) or rain water. And when you're done, dump the dirty soapy water down the toilet so it will go to the sanitary sewer and be treated.
