We will share our offering for the third quarter of 2018 with the Allied Neighborhood Wellness Center, a self described holistic health center in the Allied Neighborhood. The center has been operating in the neighborhood for more than 10 years and offers financial assistance with prescription co-pays and bus passes and gas vouchers for doctor appointments, job interviews, and emergencies. They have a personal essentials pantry. There have been support groups for those recovering from alcohol and drug dependencies. The center has one half-time staff person who has been funded by an ongoing city grant. The center has no regular source of income for or means of obtaining passes and gas vouchers that are very needed. Prairie is a long time member of Allied Partners, which is a consortium of churches that support the neighborhood as a whole.
